### SIGINT SUPPORT IN THE BORNEO TERRITORIES

#### INTRODUCTION

- 1. Approval has been given for the employment of the AMF, in conjunction with the British Army, in Sigint Operations in Borneo, subject to certain provisions including:
  - (a) AMF strength to be deployed in Borneo for those operations not to exceed 38
  - (b) Major AMF concentration to be at LABUAN with minor detachment to KUCHING which may be varied subject to approval DSD/MI8
  - (c) No move
- 2. It has been agreed by DI (MI24) Ministry of Defence, Army LONDON that DMI (MI8) Camberra should issue the necessary executive instructions.
- 3. AMF proposals concerning the basis of cost sharing between the AMF and the British Army hive yet to be approved by Ministry of Defence ondon. This instruction is written on the assumption that such will be approved.

#### AIM OF THIS INSTRUCTION

4. The aim of this instruction is to formally implement in detail the proposal approved by the Australian National Authoritisand the Principles of operations related thereto agreed between Director GCHQ, Director DSD, the British Army and the AMF.

#### RESPONSIBILITY FOR IMPLEMENTING THIS INSTRUCTION

5. Except where otherwise indicated this instruction will be implemented by CO 101 Wireless Regiment and, as delegated by him by CC 201 Sig Sqn.



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#### GENERAL OUTLINE

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(a) Purpose of operation is to conduct/Borneo Territories communications intercept, processing and reporting tasks assigned by DSD to meet the needs of both field commanders

and at an agreed time to provide resources for the direct support of the field commander (s).

- (b) Provision of Resources generally on the basis that the British Army will be responsible for manning and equipping KUCHING and the AMF similarly for IABUAN.
- (c) The operation will be mounted in three phases:
  - Phase 1: Limited reinforcement of existing sites at LABUAN and KUCHING, and limited technical improvement of existing sites as soon as possible
  - Phase 2: Provision of new and/or improved accommodation at both sites. Installation of high grade technical facilities including communications and major fainforcement of operators dependent on the availability of further British Army personneland CSO operators
  - Phase 3: Depending on the development of the operational situation, the despatch to Borneo of further processing and reporting staff and, as approved by DSD/GCO(s)/MIS, the assignment to CC 201 Sig Sqn of resources under his direct control.

#### OUTLINE ORGANISATION

'. 651 Radio Troop British Army is to come under operational ontrol 201 Sig Sqn w.e.f. date of this instruction and will be responsible for operations at KUCHING. An AMF troop will be formed from existing resources of 201 Sig Sqn which will be reinforced by up to 17 personnel from Australia. This troop will be under formand OC 201 Sig Sqn, will be responsible for operations at LABUAN and be known as 221 Signal Troop.

#### CONTROL OF OFERATION

- 8. Responsibilities will be as follows:-
  - (a) Operational Control at AHO level by DMI (MI8) in consultation with DSD and where necessary with DI (MI24) Colonel

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- (b) Operational and technical control at Unit level by CO 101 Wrls Regt and as delegated by him, by
  OC 201 Sig Sqn in consultation Col (INT) FARELF.
- (c) Control of intercept . ver and reporting

No. DSD Control is direct to unit and not thro! GCO.

- (i) <u>Phases 1 and 2.</u> Under present operational conditions in Borneo, by DSD through GCO (s) to OC 201 sig Sqn.
  - Phase 3. Under circumstances where the operational situation in BORNEO agreed by DSD/DMI (MI8)/GCO(s) to have deteriorated to a degree where direct reporting to local commanders is necessary, DSD, through GCO, will delegate to OC 201 Sig Sqn direct control of not more than 50 percent of intercept and reporting resources at each site.

#### FIXED INTERCEPT RESOURCES TO BE PROVIDED

(ii)

### 9. Labuan -

- (a) Phase 1 In existing operational accommodation provide six manual morse HF double positions one of which may be used as a voice position. (including recording)
- (b) Phase 2 In improved operational accommodation, provide a total of 8 manual morse HF double positions and 2 voice HF double positions (including recording) and provide space and inert wiring for additional 2 manual morse HF double positions and 2 voice HF double positions (including recording)
- (c) Position facilities

For Phase 2, each position provided should be equipped with facilities for split headphones and selection of each acrial provided. If practicable these facilities should also be provided for Phase 1. Spare pairs should be provided in position wiring to permit connection of each position to a concentrator, although the installation of such is not a requirement at present.

(d) Aerials

To be provided as soon as possible in accordance with recommendations by OC 201 Sig Sqn.

#### 10. KUCHING

(a) Phase 1 - In existing accommodation provide 1
additional Manual morse HF double position which may also
be used as a voice position (including recording)
Provide additional 4 manual morse HF double positiona,
using one 201 Sig Sqn intercept vehicle (originally
provided from British sources). Improve existing
aerials as far as possible.

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- (b) Phase 2 In new operational accommodation to be erected provide 7 manual morse HF double positions and 2 voice HF double positions (including recording) and provide space and inert wiring for a ditional 2 manual morse HF double positions and 1 voice HF double position (including recording). Facilities at original operational site to be closed on completion Phase 2.
- (c) Position facilities As for LABUAN but in Phase 2 only.
- (d) Aerials as for LABUAN but in Phase 2 only.
- (e) <u>Direction Finding</u> investigate suitable fixed site in proximity to proposed operational site to permit installation of DFG 29. Facilities for Signal to line steerage required in event of DFinstallation.

#### OFFRATION OF FIXED INTERCEFT RESOURCES

- 1. The operation of intercept resources provided will be in accordance with tasks issued by DSD through GCO (s) having in mind that
  - (a)  $\frac{\text{man/day working hours should not normally exceed}}{7\frac{1}{2}}$
  - (b) Every 7 days, at least 24 hours clear break must be allowed each soldier.
  - (c) task loading of stations will be in accordance with build up of personnel strength, availability to be advised by OC 201 Sig Sqn to GCO(s).

#### MOBILE INTERCEPT RESOURCES FOR RECONNAISSANCE

- 12. Separate instructions for each reconnaissance will be issued, but OC 201 Sig Sqn should
  - (a) investigate through Col (Int) FARELF the feasibility of providing a suitable aircraft, boat and/or vehicle.
  - (b) recommend to CO 101 Wireless Regiment the type of equipment to be carried for HF interception.

### COMMUNICATIONS

13. Fixed Communications between LABUAN/SINGAPORE, KUCHING/SINGAPORE and KUCHING/LABUAN are to be provided by the British authorities under arrangements GCO(s). These communications will carry as appropriate -

Steerage instructions

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and signalling, from operational sites should be instituted as soon as possible.

14. Standby and Mobile Communications

These will consist of

one mobile equipment at KUCHING two mobile equipments at LABUAN

#### PROVISION OF PERSONNEL

- 15. The following personnel are available for the operation:
  - (a) AUSTRALIAN
    - (i) from 201 Sig Sqn 21 personnel of which no more than 20 operators Signals will be employed in Borneo at the one time.
    - (ii) <u>from 101 Wireless Regiment</u> 17 personnel consisting of
      - Officer Cpl Technician Electronic Cpl Technician Electronic (Cipher) 1 Cpl Operator Keyboard and 2 Radio Cpl Operator Keyboard and -Cipher 2 Sigmn operator Keyboard and Radio 1 Sigmn operator Keyboard and 2 Cipher Clerk Signals Sigmn Technician Signals 1 Cpl Cook 1 Pte Cook Linguists/Reporters 3
    - (iii) Total Australians available

	From the above resources, a planned total of 39 only will be available. Certain personnel are earmarked for return to UK. Requirements for personnel should be submitted to Col (INT) FARELF	

Release of Australian Operators Signals will be generally dependent on the arrival there of CSO operators from the UK who are to be phased in commencing 1 Jul 64, but this will not affect release of minimum number of AMF operators required for Phase 1.

#### 17. Temporary detachment from Australia

In addition to Australian personnel mentioned in para 15 (a) above approval is given for the detachment to 201 Sig Sqn (overseas) of 1 officer and 2 technicians for a period not exceeding 2 months, to carry out technical installation duties as required.

#### DISPOSITION OF PERSONNEL

18. Personnel are to be deployed on orders CO 101 Wireless Regiment, or as delegated to him, by OC 201 Sig Sqn, subject to the following:

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- (a) the total everseas deployment of 101 Wireless Regiment not to exceed 97 with not more than 38 in the Borneo Territories,
- (b) for the limited expansion in Phase 1 not more than 5 AMF operators are to be despatched to LABUAN.
- (c) Unless DMI (MI8) approval is obtained not more than 6 AMF personnel will be employed at KUCHING at any one time.
- (d) AMF personnel are to be rotated between Singapore and the Borneo Territories. Duration of any one tour in Borneo will normally be three months.
- (e) Restrictions, if any, imposed by Col (INT) FAREIF in respect of British personnel

#### ISOVISION OF STORES AND EQUIPMENT FOR INTERCEPT FACILITIES

#### 19. Gene ral

In the ultimate installations the principle will be that IABUAN will be equipped from AUSTRALIAN sources and KUCHING from BRITISH sources.

### 20. Limited Expansion

Stores and equipment required for the limited expansion in Phase 1 are to be provided from resources UKC 200

As far as possible British source intercept equipment used at IABUAN will later be replaced from Australian Sources.

# 21. Responsibility for assessment of requirements and provision for ultimate installation

- (a) Assessment By CO 101 Wireless Regiment and as delegated to him, OC 201 Sig Sqn, at both sites.
- (b) Provision
  - (i) <u>LABUAN</u> CO 101 Wireless Regiment for items available from regimental resources and DMI (MI8) for items required from other Australian resources.
  - (ii) KUCHING By requisition on UKC 200 for on forwarding to GCHO and MOD (ARMY) LONDON for supply by either of those authorities or in the case of urgently required and available items by UKC 200.

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#### OPERATIONAL ACCOMMODATION

- 22. Phase 1 Existing accommodation will be used at both sites augmented by one intercept vehicle at KUCHING. Requirements for new accommodation for Phase 2 are to be placed with Col (Int) FARELF.
- 23. Phase 2 -
  - (a) <u>LABUAN</u> As soon as possible, the existing leased house is to be purchased and converted by the British Army to provide
    - (i) A set room for the facilities outlined in para 9 (b) above
    - (ii) Communications and terminal equipment room
    - (iii) Analysis and reporting room
    - (iv) Rest room
    - (v) Appropriate physical security arrangements

Before Phase 2 commences one 4 position intercept vehicle will be moved to the LABUAN site to ensure continuity of operations during alterations.

- (b) <u>KUCHING</u> New accommodation proximate to 9 IAA

  Regt Barracks is to be erected by the British Army
  as soon as possible to provide
  - (i) a set room for the facilities outlined in para 10 (b) above
  - (ii) Communication and terminal equipment room
  - (iii) Analysis and reporting room
  - (iv) Rest room
  - (v) Appropriate physical security arrangements

#### TIMINGS

- 24. Phase 1
  - (a) LABUAN Not before 15 June 64
  - (b) KUCHING as soon as possible
  - (c) To be implemented on instructions CO 101 Wireless Regiment.

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#### 25. Phase 2

- (a) <u>LABUAN</u> Not before 1 Jul 64 and thereafter dependent on arrival CSO operators from UK and progress building operations. DMI (MI8) in conjunction with DSD will issue instructions on dates of release of balance AMF operators Signals from Singapore.
- (b) <u>KUCHING</u> Not before 1 Jul 64 and thereafter dependent on progress building operations and arrival in theatre of additional British Army personnel.
- (c) Date of commencement of Phase 2 will be advised by DMI (MI8)

#### 26. Phase 3

Separate instructions will be issued by DMI (MI8) in consultation with DSD and GCO(s).

#### PERSONAL SECURITY

- 27. Indontrinated personnel only will be employed in this operation, and all movement to BORNEO will take place from SINGAPORE.
- 28. There will be no publicity, but it is intended that, at the appropriate time, the Australian Minister for Defence should make a statement along the lines that it has been found necessary to deploy a small number of Australian Signals personnel in Borneo to provide additional support for the Australian Fd Engr Sqn.
- 29. Each AMF soldier proceeding to Borneo will be briefed on the following agreed cover story which should be used if his presence in Borneo is queried:

"We form part of a communications detachment sent here to assist British signals units to cope with the extra signal traffic generated as a result of the deployment in Borneo of the Australian Engineer Squadron."

mention in private mail to Australia, will be made by any AMF member, of his movement to Borneo until the announcement in para 28 above has been made by the Minister for Defence.

- 30. The story covering the presence of British personnel at KUCHING is being revised by Col (INT) FARELF in consultation with GCO(s) and will be advised shortly.
- 31. Personnel will be subject to security instructions issued by the local area Commander insofar as general area security is concerned.

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#### PHYSICAL SECURITY

- 32. The following facilities are to be provided
  - (a) Security fence surrounding each site (if possible sufficiently distant from accommodation to prevent a grenade thrown from outside exploding within a lethal distance)
  - (b) appropriately secure containers for storage of sensitive material.
- 33. Guards will be provided from within Squadron resources at each site to:
  - (a) exclude unauthorised entry to operational area
  - (b) patrol at night
  - (c) occupy operational premises if not occupied by working staff.

#### ADMINISTRATION

#### 34. Responsibility for administration

Responsibility for Administration will be as follows:-

- (a) AMF as presently applicable to 201 Sig Sqn subject to local administrative authority of area commander.
- (b) British Army -
  - (i) General administration by FARELF
  - (ii) Local administration by CC 201 Sig Sqn but excluding British domestic matters which are to be handled by CC 651 Sig Tp.
- 55. Movement of Personnel and Equipment
  - (a) from Australia under arrangements 101 Wireless Regiment in conjunction with DMI (MI8). Movement by air will be normal.
  - (b) Singapore/Borneo By British Service means under arrangements made through Col (INT) FAREIF.
- Rations By local British supply on .MF repayment under arrangements through Col (INT) FARMER. AMF cooks will be employed.

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#### 37. Quarters -

- IMBUAN. Suitable hutted domestic accommodation for (a) 40 personnel is to be provided by the British Army adjacent to operational accommodation. Pending this, tentage is to be provided by the British Army under arrangements made through Col (INT) FARELF. Maintenance costs only will be paid by AMF.
- (0) KUCHING. Existing accormodation until completion Phase 2 when new domestic accommodation is to be provided for 40 personnel.

#### 38. Other Services

The following are to be provided by the British Army under arrangements made through Col (Int) FAREIF and costs are recoverable from he AMF within the normal capitation rate as now paid in respect of 201 ig Sqn personnel in Singapore

- (a) Accommodation stores including stores for messing
- (b) Medical and Dental Services
- Maintenance of Transport
- (d) Miscellaneous A & Q Services
- (e) NAAFI facilities

#### 30. Postal

OC 201 Sig Sqn is to investigate in conjunction with local Singapore Authorities the best method for handling mail for the AMF in Borneo and make the necessary recommendation to CO 101 Wireless Regiment.
