#### WITHOUT AGENDUM

NO. 2(S)/1964: REQUEST BY G.C.H.Q. FOR AUSTRALIAN TACTICAL SIGINT SUPPORT IN BORNEO

The Committee considered a request by G.C.H.Q. that Australian Army personnel from 201 Squadron, Singapore, be made available for tactical Sigint duties in Borneo.

2. The Director D.S.D. advised the Committee that more effort is needed in Borneo to take advantage of the increased tactical traffic available from Indonesian infiltration. There has been some loss of strategic signals intelligence from the area as directives. plans etc. formerly signalled to the Indonesian

are now being sent by safe hand methods. However, if Australia were to provide the additional personnel required from our Singapore resources without replacement

This could be avoided if they could be replaced by additional British personnel, either Army or civilian, from outside the theatre. Improved tactical returns would also be obtained as 201 Squadron personnel are experienced in Indonesian tasks. Further, if more staff were added to the overall theatre resources now, it would be less difficult for Australia to arrange the return of the 201 Squadron personnel at a later stage when the Borneo emergency is over.

### 3. The Defence Committee concluded:-

(a) that, as a first step, the Director D.S.D. should advise G.C.H.Q. that Australian personnel can not be made available in Borneo without leaving a very serious gap and suggest

allocation to the area of more british resources.

- (b) that, if Britain agrees to provide sufficient extra theatre personnel in Singapore approval be sought for the deployment of some 201 Squadron personnel for tactical Sigint duties in Borneo.
- (c) that, if Britain is unable to provide extra-theatre staff, the Director D.S.D. is to submit for the Committee's consideration a report on alternative methods of meeting the additional tactical requirement in Borneo.
