## DIPLOMATIC WIRELESS SERVICE TRANSMITTERS POSSIBLE INTERFERENCE TO SHOAL BAY RECEIVING STATION

- The Officer-in-Charge, Naval Communications Station, Darwin, has expressed concern and Defence Signals Division has confirmed, that transmitters being installed by the Diplomatic Wireless Service in the Army Transmitting Station, Darwin, may cause interference at the new Naval Receiving Station, Shoal Bay.
