SHOAL BAY RECEIVING STATION

The attached copies of correspondence indicate that consideration is being given to a second major road outlet from Darwin by 1980 which would cut across the southern part of the three-mile radius buffer zone. It would be appreciated if you would forward comments on the possible effect of traffic and urban development on the Receiver Station. If traffic is not considered to be a hazard to reception it might be possible to insert a clause in the leases within the three-mile radius zone on similar lines to NTA letter 65/141 dated 8th November, 1967 which stated that any electrical equipment used on these portions (which could cause interference to Coonawarra West Receiver Station) shall be screened in a manner satisfactory to the Administration to prevent road interference.
